Goodness on Display

God is good. Like a traveler to a compass, I cling to this truth.

But sometimes I have doubts. After all, what is good about suffering, loss, and all the broken things in a fallen world?

Apart from God—nothing.

In Psalm 31, David rehearses his anguish over his troubles while affirming his trust in a good God. As he concludes his complaints, verse 19 erupts like sunshine through clouds, expressing overwhelming amazement in God's goodness:

Oh, how abundant is your goodness, which you have stored up for those who fear you and worked for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of the children of mankind!

After 18 verses of pouring out his deep brokenness while imploring God's help, how could the psalmist break out in praise?

As he ends the psalm, he confesses that it is in times of great need that the Lord hears and protects. The psalmist realizes it is the trials that highlight God's goodness, love, and power.

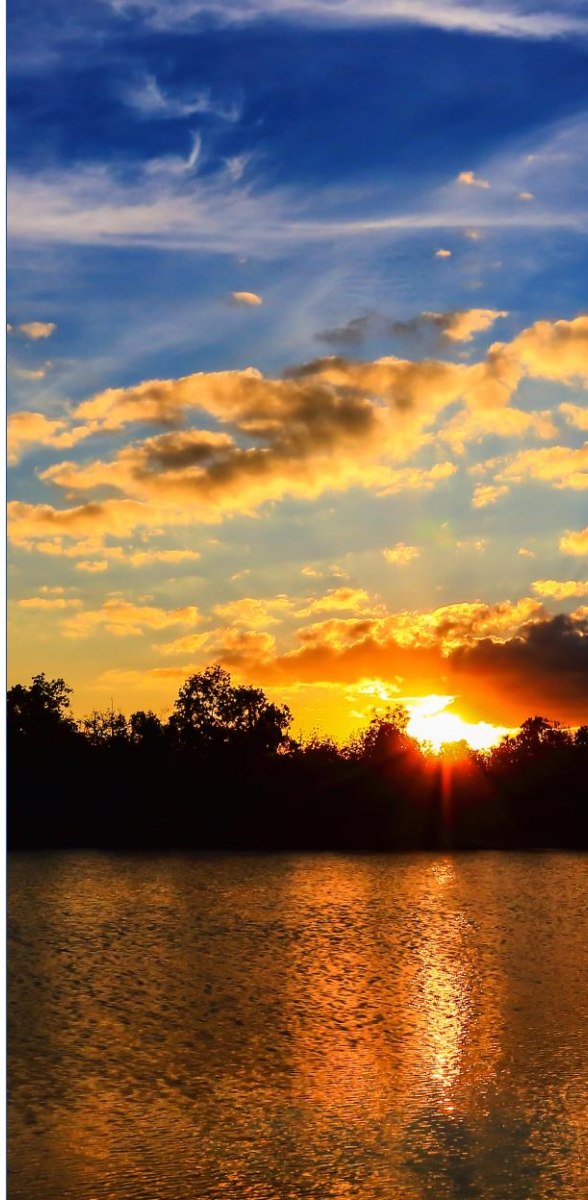
God Is Holding Me
